According to the charging document, the state accused Barragan of trying to defraud one man and the Hermiston Classics Car Club on multiple occasions in August. Court records show Barragan has criminal convictions going back to 1997 for burglary, theft and multiple driving violations. He remains in the Umatilla County Jail, Pendleton.
•Hermiston police arrested Kaitlyn May Kelly, 24, of Hermiston, for failure to appear, identity theft, second-degree forgery, negotiating a bad check, and second-degree theft. The unofficial kickoff to the holiday season in Hermiston is just around the corner.

In addition, the Family Day is open to everyone. And, tickets are available for a chance to win a special raffle tree.
The gala event is Saturday, Dec. 1 at the Hermiston Community Center, 415 S. Highway 395. It begins at 6 p.m., with dinner served at 7 p.m. People without dinner tickets are invited to arrive prior to the start of the live auction at 8 p.m. A no-host
