

Ulyses Lopez named to all-state team

Riverside junior Ulyses Lopez was named to the 3A/2A/1A all-state first team as a forward.

Lopez helped the Pirates (12-4-1) to the 3A state semifinals, where they dropped a 6-2 game to Oregon Episcopal.

Joining Lopez on the all-state team were teammates Gerardo Lopez (F, so.), Ricky Davila (D, so.) and Huberto Sanchez (D, fr.), who were named

to the second team. Francisco Chavez (F, sr.) was selected to the honorable mention team.

Umatilla goalie Roberto Lugo earned second-team honors. The Vikings lost a 6-1 game to Oregon Episcopal in the first round of the 3A state tournament.

On the girls team, Riverside senior defenseman Estrella Daltoso was selected to the honorable mention team.

JOSEPH 62, HELIX 48 — Helix fell to Joseph in a round two consolation matchup on Friday.

Lino Covarrubia led the way with 17 points. Peyton Smith and Danny Telles had eight each.

The Knights (6-0) will head to Stevenson, Washington, on Saturday.
