Pendleton
no match
for Crook
County in
IMC dual

Before Pendleton left for its Inter-mountain Conference match at Crook County, coach Fred Phillips said the Cowboys were one of the toughest teams in the state. He was not wrong. Crook County won 12 of 14 matches Thursday against the visiting Bucks in cruising to a 69-9 victory. Chris Chambers was the first Buck to pick up a victory, recording an 8-2 decision over Gage Perry at 138 pounds to trim the Cowboys' lead to 33-3. Pendleton's Isaac Urbina pinned Gavin McLean in 5:02 at 160 pounds, and that was it for the Bucks. The Cowboys won 11 of their matches by fall, with heavyweight Caleb Parrott recording the quickest pin of 33 seconds over Travis McGee. The Bucks will wrestle at the Ore-gon Classic on Friday and Saturday at the Redmond Fairgrounds.

Pasco grapplers overpower
Hermiston in MCC match

Pasco's veteran lineup was more than Hermiston could handle Thursday night. Pasco won all but three matches en route to a 57-12 victory over the visiting Bulldogs in Mid-Columbia Conference action. "Hermiston has a strong team," Pasco coach Jay Covington said. "I know they are young, but they had a lot of grit and fight. The score doesn't say that, but it was a good battle each time on the mat." Hermiston's Trevor Wagner opened the match with a 12-7 decision over Travis Thorne at 160 pounds, but it was all Pasco until the match rolled around to 106 pounds. "They are tough," Hermiston coach Kyle Larson said. "We have to understand who we are wrestling, but you can't be happy with 57-12. We left guys home tonight and we didn't have two guys in the middle, and they could have been winnable matches."

At 106, Hermiston's Zayne Helfer posted a 5-2 decision over Jesus Manzo. Helfer had the upper hand the entire match until Manzo got a reversal late in the third round. Adrian Delgado continued his successful season with a pin of Andre Rodriguez at 113. Delgado led 11-1 in the second round before pinning Rodriguez in 2:43. "Delgado looked phenomenal," Larson said. "Maybe one of his best matches. He has been putting in the extra time, and it shows." At 120, Isaac Lambert matched Pasco's Ed Manzo point for point to force overtime. Lambert got an escape with 21 seconds left in regulation to tie the score at 4-4, but Manzo managed a takedown 24 seconds into the extra round for a 6-4 victory. At 220, Hermiston's Jon Lee battled Damion Silva to the bitter end. Tied at 4-4 in the first, Silva got an escape and a take-down to take a 7-4 lead into the second round. Silva won the match 10-5.

Edwards helps Arizona St
hold on to edge Oregon St

TEMPE, Ariz. — Rob Edwards' 13 points included two clutch free throws in the final seconds, and Arizona State held on to hand Oregon State its first Pac-12 loss of the season, 70-67, on Thursday night. The Sun Devils (12-5, 3-2 in Pac-12) have won 10 straight games over the Beavers at Wells Fargo Arena. Zylan Cheatham had 10 points and 13 rebounds, and five Sun Devils scored in double figures to offset a pair of 21-point performances from Oregon State's Tres Tinkle and Ethan Thompson. Oregon State rallied from an 18-point second-half deficit to trail by one and almost took the lead. Cheatham slammed home a missed shot for a 68-64 lead, but Tinkle hit from distance again to make it a one-point game with 22 seconds left. Ore-

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White scores 16, Oregon
holds off Arizona 59-54

TUCSON, Ariz. — Paul White scored 16 points and Victor Bailey Jr. added 13, helping Oregon hold off Arizona 59-54 Thursday night. The once-fast Ducks have had to slow down in recent games due to a string of injuries, relying on their defense rather than outscoring opponents. Oregon (11-6, 2-2 Pac-12) got Kenny Wooten back after missing four games with a broken jaw, though he played limited minutes and star freshman Bol Bol was on the bench in a walking boot. The Ducks still stuck to their shut-them-down game plan, hounding Arizona (13-5, 4-1) into one miss after another while building a 13-point lead midway through the second half. The Wildcats found an offensive rhythm and pulled within 55-51 on Dylan Smith's 3-pointer with 1:24 left. Smith hit another 3 to get Arizona within 57-54 with four seconds left, but

Payton Pritchard hit two free throws to seal it. Chase Jeter led the Wildcats with 12 points and 10 rebounds. Arizona took control of the early Pac-12 race after an uneven nonconference schedule. The Wildcats opened conference play with wins over Colorado and Utah at home and had a road sweep of the Bay Area schools last week. The Ducks had a rough start to the Pac-12, losing to rival Oregon State and blowing an eight-point lead in the final 45 seconds of an overtime loss to UCLA. Oregon bounced back with a 21-point win over USC in one of its best all-around games of the season. The Ducks were good on the defensive end against Arizona, holding the Wildcats without a field goal for nearly eight minutes while building a nine-point lead. Oregon held Arizona to 23 points, 8-of-27 shooting, including 2 for 11 from the 3-point arc and forced nine

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
