She worked as a bartender/cocktail waitress at the Silver Saddle, Frontier Tavern where she learned to play pool, and at Harris Pine Mills. She had been captain of her pool team for the Frontier Tavern and took first several times. She also was secretary and president of the City Pool League.

After her first and sec-

ond divorce she moved back to Pendleton, working odd jobs still with the Frontier and Pony Keg, Avon and her own health nutrition business, and a cage cashier at Wildhorse Casino. In 2000 she became
