

# Westbrook sets new triple-double record in Thunder win

OKLAHOMA CITY — Russell Westbrook set an NBA record with his 10th straight triple-double and Paul George scored 47 points, as the Oklahoma City Thunder beat the visiting Portland Trail Blazers 120-111 on Monday night.

Westbrook broke a tie with Wilt Chamberlain, who had nine straight triple-doubles in 1968, by finishing with 21 points, 14 rebounds and 11 assists. He clinched the record on an assist to George for a 3-pointer with 3:52 remaining in the fourth quarter. It was his 23rd triple-double of the season and the 127th of his career.

George had 12 rebounds and 10 assists for the third triple-double of

his career.

Rookie Deonte Burton had a career-high 18 points and Raymond Felton added a season-high 15 for the Thunder.

Damian Lillard scored 31 points and Jake Layman added 17 for Portland.

The Thunder shot 56 percent in the first half to lead 68-49 at the break. George scored 21 points and Felton added 15.

The Trail Blazers started the second half on a 7-0 run to make things interesting, and they trimmed Oklahoma City's lead to 87-82 by the end of the third quarter.

Westbrook had five assists heading into the fourth, and he reentered the game after a rest with 9:36 remaining.

He got his first assist of the quarter with 6:54 left, but was up

to his ninth with 4:57 to play.

**Trail Blazers:** CJ McCollum was called for a technical in the second quarter. ... McCollum shot 4 for 15 and Lillard 1 for 10 in the first half. ... Portland shot 33.3 percent in the first half of Monday's game.

**Thunder:** Forward Jerami Grant (right ankle sprain) and guard Dennis Schroder (personal reasons) did not play. ... George scored 17 points in the first quarter. ... Burton hit a 3-pointer at the first-quarter buzzer. ... Forward Patrick Patterson got his fourth start of the season in Grant's place.

## Stuhec spoils Vonn's farewell party at skiing worlds

ARE, Sweden — The Lindsey Vonn circus had rolled back into town, and that suited Ilka Stuhec just fine.

All the talk at the world championships on Sunday was whether Vonn could mark the last race of her career with a victory in the downhill. The spotlight, as ever, was almost totally on the American.

Stuhec ended up spoiling the party.

With Vonn sitting on the leader's throne and the potential of a glorious finale increasing by the minute, Stuhec produced a flawless run from No. 9 in the field to top her rival and become the first woman to retain the world downhill title since Maria Walliser in 1989.

"She has won everything, won so much, and I was really honored to be there (on the podium) with her for her last time," the Slovenian skier said of Vonn.

Vonn, who finished third, was the last skier to leave the finish area after all the

celebrations with her family and friends, the person the legion of photographers wanted to snap, the one Swedish great Ingemar Stenmark had traveled to watch.

But this was also a day to savor for Stuhec, who — like Vonn — has proved capable of bouncing back from serious injury.

She missed all of last season after tearing a ligament in her left knee during a crash while training in Austria. She watched the Winter Olympics last February from home, getting up at 3 a.m. like a "crazy fan."

Initial results this season were mixed but Stuhec underlined her threat ahead of the worlds by winning the downhill and super-G at Val Gardena in December.

She was way too good for the rest Sunday, winning by 0.23 seconds from Corinne Suter and 0.49 from Vonn, to successfully defend her title from St. Moritz, Switzerland, in 2017. The fact it was a shortened course, because of fog and wind, made the margin of victory even more impressive.
