Homes reflect homeowners in 'One of a Kind'

A style story: Home renovation shows are more popular than ever, empowering homeowners to tap into the latest home trends and styles. But a new series goes beyond what's trending to showcase truly unique transformations.

Interior designer Grace Mitchell — the popular blogger behind *astoriedstyle.com* — taps into a family's history as she creates new spaces within their home in "One of a Kind," premiering Tuesday, March 19, on HGTV. She and her fun-loving crew go all out as they renovate homes to reflect the stories and passions of those who live there.

The eight-episode series follows Mitchell as she gets to know her clients and comes up with clever ways to add personal touches to their spaces, not just humdrum store-bought decor.

"Anyone can have a home that's catalog pretty, but a home should tell the story of the family that lives there," Mitchell said in a news release. "My team and I take boring, outdated homes and give them personality and style."

She uses what she learns about her clients to design innovative, personalized solutions that are custom-tailored to each family. In one episode, she creates a whimsical ice cream parlor for a family with a history in the ice cream industry. Some of her unconventional ideas featured in "One of a Kind" include personalized wallpaper made from a collection of love notes, wall art created with a rusted antique car, custom 3D wallpaper and a fiber-optic night sky on a dining room ceiling. She incorporates a favorite saying into a backsplash and finishes cabinets with images of special places. Her crew also revamps the upstairs of a Victorian home to give a little girl a special bedroom.

No matter what the project, Mitchell's passion for interior design shines through as she gives families truly unique homes in "One of a Kind," airing Tuesday, March 19, on HGTV.

Ready, set, paint!: Once in a blue moon, a TV series comes along and sparks a trend, from culinary competitions to home makeovers. Luckily for fans of home reno shows, the show that started it all is back in action.

Host Paige Davis welcomes homeowners, designers and carpenters to redecorate each other's places in the new season of "Trading Spaces," which airs Saturday, March 23, on TLC. It's been nearly two decades since the show first took TV by storm during its original run from 2000 to 2008. TLC rebooted the series last season to the surprise and delight of fans, and now it's back for season 10.

The new version closely resembles the first as neighbors or friends trade keys and homes for the weekend to tackle a room in each other's houses on a modest budget. Participants also have the help of a designer and a carpenter, but they have to finish the room in the allotted time and on budget, which often means late nights of painting, painting and more painting.

In addition to Davis, who hosted the show from 2001 to 2004 and again in 2008, season 10 features the return of many fan-favorite designers and carpenters from past seasons. Viewers can tune in to see original series personalities such as Hildi Santo Tomas, Doug Wilson, Frank Bielec, Vern Yip, Carter Oosterhouse, Laurie Smith and Ty Pennington. They can also catch new carpenters Brett Tutor and Joanie Sprague, along with new designers Sabrina Soto, John Gidding and Kahi Lee. Also new

to the fold in season 10 is designer Mikel Welch.

This season, they tackle attics, basements, twin sisters' houses and the homes of ex-spouses, as well as a teachers lounge. Don't miss a new season of home-decorating hijinks and shocking reveals in "Trading Spaces," airing Saturday, March 23, on TLC.

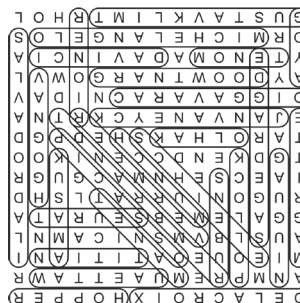
