

The Stanfield Planning Commission will hold a public hearing regarding a proposal to amend the City of Stanfield Development Code. The change would affect all the properties in Residential Zone from 15 feet to 10 feet. The following statement is required by state law: The City of Stanfield has not made a determination regarding how these amendments would affect the value of your property. Adoption of these amendments may affect the permissible uses of your property, and other properties in the affected zone, and may change the value of your property.

The amendment being considered and the City Staff report is available for inspection at Stanfield City Hall located at 160 South Main Street, Stanfield, OR 97875. Copies of the proposed amendment are available for purchase at a cost of \$0.10 per page.
