Martine Kraft is an acclaimed Norwegian artist and composer, combining her traditional Nordic sounds with raw power and haunting, dreamlike soundscapes.

As well as being a virtuoso on the hardingfiddle, she is a talented composer with a unique voice.

Fred Hill Sr. is a singer and drummer who has taught tribal drum and dance history and the Umatilla language at Nixyaawii Community School since it opened in 2004. He has collaborated with a range of musicians from around the world.

Producer and instrumentalist Nils Kraft balances the two worlds on acoustic guitar and piano while the songs playfully adjust to the direction of each tradition.
