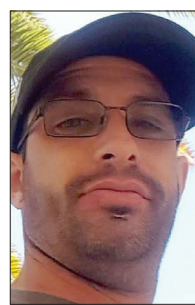
and moving to Pendleton. While here he met and fell in love with his wife Danielle. The two were married on July 4, 2018.
