DAYS GONE BY

100 Years Ago From the East Oregonian Aug. 21, 1919

Charged with leaving a camp fire burning which started a 3,000 acre fire in the central part of the Wenaha forest east of Toll Gate on the Oregon side, James Ross, sheep herder for the Leaser estate, pleaded guilty this morning before Judge C.H. Marsh and was fined and severely reprimanded. Ross was brought to Pendleton today by E.N. Kavanaugh and T.M. Talbot, forest service officials who had been investigating fire conditions in the forest.

50 Years Ago From the East Oregonian Aug. 21, 1969

Two officers of the U.S. Navy Attack Squadron 145 based at Whidbey Island Naval Air Station died in a plane accident on a routine training mission about 10:30 p.m. Tuesday on the Navy bombing range near

Boardman. A Navy spokesman said the officers killed in the plane crash were the pilot, Cmdr. Richard Walls, 39, Oak Harbor, Wash., and his bombardier-navigator, Lt. Benny Cochran, 27, also of Oak Harbor. The plane was an ACA Intruder. The jet was making a practice run at the time of the crash about four miles southwest of the main tower.

25 Years Ago From the East Oregonian Aug. 21, 1994

First Presbyterian Church of Pendleton honored two longtime members with a recent birthday party during fellowship time after services. Morton Elder of Pendleton celebrated his 98th birthday July 20. He joined the church in 1906. Several of his nieces and nephews attended the party. Kathreen Purchase turned 104 on July 14. She has been a church member since 1933.

TODAY IN HISTORY

On August 21, 1609, Galileo Galilei demonstrated his new telescope to a group of officials atop the Campanile in Venice.

In 1831, Nat Turner launched a violent slave rebellion in Virginia resulting in the deaths of at least 55 whites. (Turner was later executed.)

In 1863, pro-Confederate raiders attacked Lawrence, Kansas, massacring the men and destroying the town's buildings.

In 1911, Leonardo da Vinci's "Mona Lisa" was stolen from the Louvre Museum in Paris. (The painting was recovered two years later in Italy.)

In 1940, exiled Communist revolutionary Leon Trotsky died in a Mexican hospital from wounds inflicted by an assassin the day before.

In 1963, martial law was declared in South Vietnam as police and army troops began a violent crackdown on Buddhist anti-govern-

ment protesters. In 1983, the musical play "La Cage Aux Folles" opened on Broadway.

In 1991, the hard-line coup against Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev collapsed in the face of a popular uprising led by Russian Federation President Boris N. Yeltsin.

In 1992, an 11-day siege began at the cabin of white separatist Randy Weaver in Ruby Ridge, Idaho, as government agents tried to arrest Weaver for failing to appear in court on charges of selling two illegal sawed-off shotguns; on the first day of the siege, Weaver's teenage son, Samuel, and Deputy U.S. Marshal William Degan were killed.

In 1993, in a setback for NASA, engineers lost contact with the Mars Observer spacecraft as it was about to reach the red planet on a \$980 million mission.

In 1995, ABC News settled a \$10 billion libel suit by apologizing to Philip Mor-

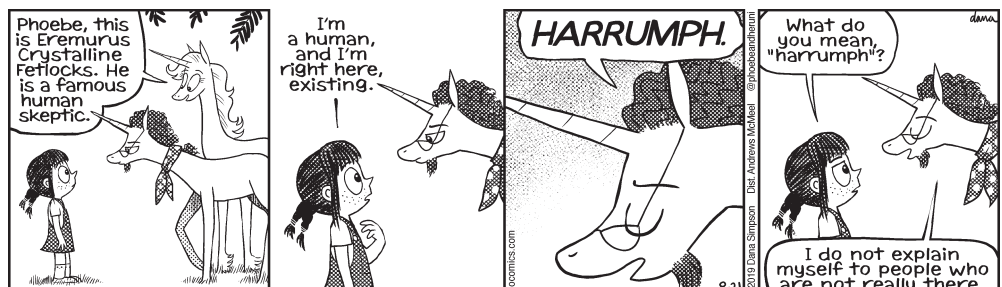
ris for reporting the tobacco giant had manipulated the amount of nicotine in its cigarettes.
