He immediately joined the His-panic Soccer League and discovered his passion for coaching youth soccer. He officially started coaching the Pendleton middle school girls in 2006, and from that point on he always had at least one team that he was coaching, whether it be girls, boys or adults.

Cesar was very well known in the soccer com-munities of Eastern Oregon and southeast Washington. He took several adult teams to tournaments, while con-tinuing to coach his youth teams. Many of his teams went undefeated for years. Cesar completed his GED at Blue Mountain Commu-nity College alongside his

wife in 2010 while working full-time and continuing to coach and play soccer.

Those who worked and played with Cesar will always remem-ber his char-isma for life and his abil-ity to brighten a room with his personal-ity and positiv-ity. His love and pride for Hon-duras was evi-dent whenever he spoke of his

home country. Cesar will be greatly missed by all who were fortunate enough to have known him. His soccer players will miss a coach who inspired them to always play with their heart.

Cesar is preceded in death by his father, Cesar Ernesto Argueta. He is survived by his mother, Maria Concepcion Argue-ta-Acosta; sisters, Lidia, Vilma and Mirian; chil-dren, Fabian, Susana, Cesar and Marisol; and grandkids, Lionel and Aullie.

Program steps out to increase student safety

PENDLETON — A hand-ful of schools in Pendleton are participating in an initia-tive to increase safety as stu-dents walk and ride bicycles to school.

A special program is designed to identify how to improve streets in the area to support kids in getting to school safely. Safe Routes to School Walk Audits and Community Meetings are featured the week of Oct. 7 as part of the project. The effort is a cooperative proj-ect between Umatilla County, the city of Pendleton and the Pendleton School District.

Pendleton recently received funding from the Oregon Department of Trans-portation Safe Routes to School Project Identifica-tion Process. The funding is for creating a Safe Routes to School Plan, which will also outline opportunities for edu-cation and encouragement events to promote walking and biking to school. Planners from Alta Planning + Design will lead the planning process.

The Walk Audits and Community Meetings will identify walking and biking opportunities and challenges around the school area. Alta planners, school leadership, roadway authority represen-tatives and family members will document conditions that may discourage walking and biking to school, and work to identify solutions to these challenges.

All Walk Audits will begin at the flagpole in front

of each school. Students, par-ents, teachers and community members are invited to partic-ipate. The schedule is:

- Pendleton Early Learning Center, Monday, Oct. 7: Walk, 2:15 p.m.; Meeting, 3:15 p.m.
- Pendleton High School & Hawthorne School, Tuesday, Oct. 8: Walk, 7:30 a.m.; Meet-ing, 8:30 a.m.
- McKay Creek Elemen-tary School, Tuesday, Oct. 8: Walk, 2:30 p.m.; Meeting, 3:30 p.m.
- Sherwood Heights Ele-mentary School, Wednesday, Oct. 9: Walk, 7:45 a.m.; Meet-ing, 8:45 a.m.
- Sunridge Middle School, Wednesday, Oct. 9: Walk, 2:15 p.m.; Meeting, 3:15 p.m.
- Washington Elemen-tary School, Thursday, Oct. 10: Walk, 7:45 a.m.; Meeting, 8:45 a.m.

Following each Walk Audit, there will be a Com-munity Meeting to brain-storm improvements for walking and biking to school and discuss opportunities for Safe Routes education and encouragement.
