September 14, 1960 — September 23, 2019

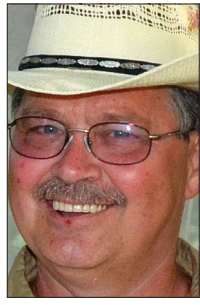
Edward (Eddie) G. Winks, 59, of Pilot Rock, Oregon, passed away on September 23, 2019, in his home.
