OBITUARY

Donald Edward Peterson

lone

June 20, 1925 — January 2, 2020



Peterson, 94, died on January 2, 2020, at Richland, Washington. He was born on June 20, 1925, at the family homestead in the Valby area south of Lone, Ore., to Oscar and Esther Engstrom Peterson. He attended the Rocky Bluff schoolhouse and Lone High School before graduating from Grant High School in Port-land, Ore. Following high school, he served in WWII as a U.S. Navy SeaBee. He was a ste-vedore in the Philippines and China. He attended Oregon State College, majoring in agri-cultural engineering, and in 1949 married Martha Han-son at Augustana Lutheran Church in Portland. They moved to Lone in 1950 to begin a lifetime of farming and ranching in the Valby area. He continued the fam-ily tradition that began with the Swedish homesteaders settling in the area in the late 1800s. He always worked to maintain family involve-ment in farming that is now into its fifth generation. The tragic 1948 Vanport flood in Portland, Ore., gave Donald the opportunity to purchase one of the flooded houses. With the help of his father-in-law Verner Han-son, they dismantled this house and hauled it to East-ern Oregon on a farm truck. Donald rebuilt it on his Pine Lane Ranch farmland and is where he and Martha would raise their family. An active participant in several agricultural orga-nizations, Peterson served as president of the Oregon Wheat Growers League and on the league's transporta-tion and federal programs committees; he continued his involvement into retire-ment. He was also state pres-ident and national director of the National Farmers Orga-nization. His farm received the Conservation Farm of the Year for Morrow County in 1957. His community involvement included serv-ing on the Morrow County ASCS committee, the Mor-row County Resource Coun-cil, and the business advi-sory council of the Job Training Partnership Act. He also served on the Council of Economic Development for Oregon. He helped create MorGrass Grazing Associ-ation that initially obtained summer cattle pasture for local ranchers in the Val-by-Gooseberry area. Oregon State University College of Agricultural Sciences hon-ored him as a Diamond Pio-neer in 2008. He was several cred-its short of graduating from Oregon State College in 1950. During his years of farming wheat, Peterson got to know Mike Martin of Oregon State University's agricultural eco-nomics depart-ment. Martin helped him qual-ify for graduation 41 years later. In the 1960s he helped build Arbuckle Moun-tain Ski area, where he taught his kids how to ski. He loved boating and was a member of Hat Rock Yacht Club for many years. He was an avid golfer and member of Wil-low Creek Golf Club. Peterson also maintained a lifelong interest in politics and economics, and he kept up with current events to his dying day. When Martha, the love of his life, had a major stroke in 1994, he retired from farm-ing to care for her. Despite their physical limitations, they still traveled the world. Donald had a strong faith his entire life. He was a longtime member of Valby Lutheran Church, which his grandfather Peter-son and great-grandfather Olson helped found in 1886. During early times Don-ald helped move the Rocky Bluff schoolhouse to become the parish hall. Through the ALC he served on world hunger relief efforts. He became a member of Peace Lutheran Church fol-lowing a move to assisted living in Pendleton, Ore. His home at the time of his death was Suttle Care & Retire-ment. The family is thankful to the staff there for the love and care they provided. The family is also thankful for his special friends, includ-ing Rich Mattes and John Spencer. He was preceded in death by his parents, wife Martha, sister Eunice Peterson Kvis-tad and brother-in-law Rod, brother Gerald Peterson, and son-in-law Richard Lindner. He is survived by his four children: Kerry Peter-son (Ina) of Lone, Kristine Lindner of Hermiston, Paul Peterson of Lone, and Joel Peterson (Lea Mathieu) of Lone; and by grandchildren Emily Guernsey (Gary), Aaron Lindner (Yesenia), Luke Peterson (Sarah), Erik Peterson (Brittenae), August Peterson (Samantha), Oskar Peterson, and Bab-ali Peterson. He had seven great-grandchildren. Memorial donations may be made to Peace Lutheran Church, 210 N.W.
