funny, kind and helpful. He accepted everyone, no matter what, even though he himself was judged by many that didn’t know his story.

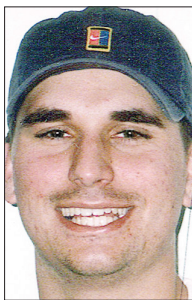
But regardless of everything, he remained his positive happy-go-lucky self.

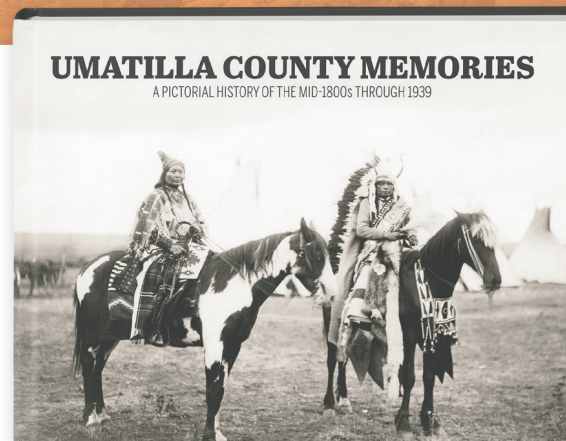
