#### Verlyn Paul Schulz was to Verlyn's life, but it was born on December 13, 1940, in Parsons, Kansas, and died on January 1, 2021, at his home in Hermiston, Oregon, at the age

of 80 years. As a child, Verlyn's family left their dust storm-ruined Kansas farm and moved to the fruit orchards of Washington. Over the years, Verlyn moved several times before settling with his parents and four siblings in Echo, Oregon, when he was in

elementary school.

Verlyn graduated from Echo High School in 1958 and then from Concordia Teachers College in Seward, Nebraska. He returned home to teach elementary school PE in Hermiston, where he met his wife Janet, another Hermiston teacher. They were married June 14, 1969, and Verlyn continued teaching at West Park and Highland Hills until his retirement in 1998. Former students report that his classes were fun and lively, energetic and creative, fair and inclusive. He thoroughly enjoyed the hundreds of kids he came to know as their teacher.

In his spare time, Verlyn loved building and farming, including the construction of his own home and farm in the early 1970s where he and Jan welcomed their two children — Michael and Ericka. 
