Caption: City of Milton-Freewater General Obligation Bond Authorization for Police Station

Question: Shall Milton-Freewater issue \$7.7 million in general obligation bonds to provide a police station? If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of sections 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Summary: Approval of this measure authorizes the City to issue a principal amount of up to \$7.7 million of general obligation bonds. Proceeds of the bonds would pay capital costs to provide a police station on existing City land. Specifically the new police station is expected to: House the Milton-Freewater police patrol House the 911 emergency dispatch operations Be seismically sound and accessible to all, including people with disabilities Provide increased safety of police officers and dispatchers Increase efficiency of operations with additional work space, technology, and heating and air conditioning Provide space for citizens to have privacy and safety while conducting business with the police department This measure is estimated to result in a tax of \$0.87 per \$1,000 of assessed value, or approximately \$7.25 per month on a home assessed at \$100,000. Levy rates may differ due to actual interest rates at the time of issuance and changes in assessed value. Bonds may be issued in multiple series and each series would mature in 30 years or less.
