The total approved budget includes the Bond Construction Funds, totaling approximately \$83.4M which is down approximately 8.5% as the design and construction phases progress; three federal grant funds totaling approximately \$15.9M, designated for COVID-19 response; the state funded Summer Learning Program Grant at \$2.2M and the General Fund budgeted at \$77.815M, which is essentially the same as the prior year. The General Fund will remain constant due to enrollment declines, and adjustments to state and federal poverty allocation, offset by a significantly larger beginning fund balance and use of reserve funds.
