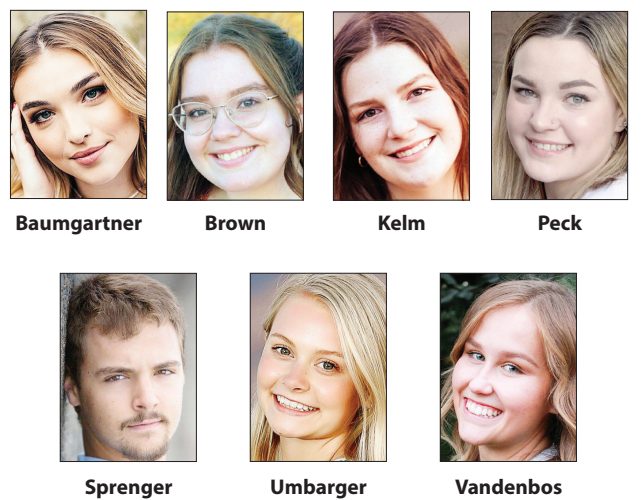

Ione alums receive McElligott scholarships

IONE — Three Ione High School alumni have been named recipients of the 2021-22 Maryan L. McElligott Memorial Scholarship.
Tristan Estabrook, a senior studying nursing at Oregon Health Sciences University and a repeat awardee, received \$3,500. **Zoey Gilbert**, a sophomore studying nuclear and industrial radiologic technologies at Blue Mountain

Community College, and **Annabella McDaniel**, a sophomore studying child, family and social work at Blue Mountain Community College, each received \$2,500.
 The Maryan L. McElligott Memorial Scholarship fund has awarded scholarships to Ione High School alumni each year since 1997. The scholarship is open to all college undergraduates, with preference given to students in their sophomore year and above. The fund was established in her memory after she lost her battle with cancer.
 Maryan McElligott was an energetic community volunteer who was recognized in 1992 as the Morrow County Woman of the Year. She placed a high value on community involvement. She volunteered in the schools, the American Legion Auxiliary Ione Post 95, and was a 20-year 4-H leader. An avid baker, she was well-known for her cakes and taught cake decorating classes through Blue Mountain Community College.
 Education was very important to her. Maryan and her late husband, L.J. McElligott who passed in March 2020, raised eight children, all of whom graduated from Ione High School as well as college; five have received graduate degrees.
 "Preference is given to students in their sophomore through senior years of college. However, we encourage students to apply every single year of one's college experience," said Vince McElligott, committee chair.
 The scholarship committee is composed of Ione residents Monica Swanson, Linda LaRue and Anne Morter, as well as, Matthew McElligott of North Powder and Vince McElligott of Houston, Texas, two of Maryan's sons.
 Scholarships are awarded to students who share and demonstrate Maryan's values, but may lack financial resources needed to pursue their college education. The following criteria are used to select scholarship recipients: high academic achievement; demonstrated character; community, family and school involvement; and financial need. The L.J. McElligott family initially set up the endowment fund in 1994, and it is administered by the Oregon Community Foundation.
 The Maryan L. McElligott Memorial Scholarship fund makes annual awards to graduates of Ione High School who are enrolled or will be enrolled in a full-time undergraduate course of study at any accredited post-secondary institution, including out-of-state institutions. Applicants, including McElligott scholarship recipients, may reapply each year as long as they meet the eligibility requirements. All Ione Community Charter School graduates are encouraged to apply. Applications are available through the Oregon Student Access Commission at www.oregonstudentaid.gov.

Thomas Norman Tangney

Pendleton

Thomas Norman Tangney, 89, of Pendleton, died Wednesday, June 23, 2021, at Providence St. Mary Medical Center in Walla Walla, Washington.
 He was born on May 12, 1932, to Melvin and Helen (Looney) Tangney in Huntington, Oregon.

Tangney was offered a full-ride athletic scholarship to Pacific University upon graduating from Crook County High School in 1951, but he answered the call to enlist in the Marine Corps on July 24, 1951. He was deployed to Korea in November of 1951 and served in "G" Company, 3rd Battalion, 4th Marines, 3rd Marine Division, Fleet Marine Force, as a corporal. His only brother, Clarence Arthur Tangney, was killed in action at Heartbreak Ridge on Nov. 3, 1952. Tangney was removed from the combat zone as a sole surviving son and was honorably discharged on March 6, 1953.

Tangney returned to Prineville, Oregon, and reunited with his high school sweetheart, Maxine Marie Nicholas. They were married on Nov. 20, 1953. They had three children, one each year in September: Linda in 1954, Clarence in 1955, and Thomas in 1956. Linda Tangney died at the age of 2, just six days before Thomas was born.
 The family moved to Pendleton in 1955 when

Tangney was hired at Mid-State Lumber Company. He went to work for Carnation in 1958, delivering milk door to door. In 1980, he started the family business, Daisy Milk Company, with his wife and two sons. The family sold the business in 2001. Tangney never could stop working, so he went to work for the city of Pendleton in 2003 and retired again at age 85.

Tangney was a dedicated father, grandfather and great-grandfather. He was an avid hunter who was always on the go. He dedicated his life to community service, lending a hand to as many social clubs and community events as possible. His most notable contributions came through his involvement with VFW Post 922 of Pendleton, where he worked tirelessly to honor and support our nation's veterans.

He was preceded in death by his parents, brother and daughter. He is survived by his wife, two sons, six grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.

A memorial service will be held Wednesday, June 30, at 1 p.m. at the Pendleton Convention Center.

Alfred Jordon Pinkham was born Feb. 8, 1927, in Tsa Weekta, Idaho, and passed away on June 28, 2021.

His Ni Mii Puu name was E Loo Tase La Kat Tset, which means One Who Stands On a High Point Signaling. This name was from his grandfather, who participated in the War of 1877, and his name was Johnny Pinkham.

He resided at his home on the Red Bear estate in Lenore, Idaho. His parents were Alex M. Pinkham Sr. and Annette Blackeagle. His mother was a direct descendant of Old Chief Joseph and other chiefs of the tribe. Blackeagle was a treaty signer of 1868.

Surviving siblings are Alvin Sr. and Allen Pinkham Sr. Other siblings were Albert Sr., Alex Jr., Audrey, Priscilla, Leroy, Loretta and Bernadine.
 His children are Ron, Renita Brien, twin Melvin

(deceased), and Wayne Pinkham (deceased). He married Marian Johnson (deceased), Jan Broncheau (deceased), and most currently was married to Darlene Greene, who was always beside him and who especially took care of him during his final years.

Alfred worked at Disneyland and as a welder for a tire rim company in Corona, California. He also worked at Orofino Mills. In 1978 he returned back to the reservation and worked at the Omark Industries bullet factory before retiring.

Services will be at the Pi-nee-waus, Lapwai, Idaho, or the Nez Perce Tribal Longhouse, Spaulding, Idaho, on Monday, June 28, 2021. Dressing is at 2 p.m., with a funeral on Tuesday, June 29, 2021, officiated by Armand Minthorn.
