Bucks have 5 players selected, Porter is Coach of the Year

ENDLETON — There was hardly a night where Pendleton girls basketball coach Kevin Porter had the same lineup in his scorebook as he did the game before.

Injuries, family trips and other life moments had Porter shuffling his roster, but the Bucks still found success, including a nine-game win streak tucked into the

Local 3A baseball players rake in awards

IRRIGON — The 3A Special District 5 coaches recently handed out all-league honors, albeit with a little twist.

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, and because a full league schedule was not played, there was just one list of players. There was no Player of the Year or Coach of the Year.

Umatilla had three players chosen while Irrigon and Riverside each had two.

Seniors Tyler Garrett, James Wilson and Ryan Lorence were chosen from Umatilla.

Irrigon junior Frank Chapa and sophomore Braden Atkins earned honors, as did Riverside seniors Will Keefer and Cooper Szasz.

Wilson was a multifaceted player for the 8-7 Vikings. On the mound, he was 3-1 with a 4.50 ERA. He struck out 36 and walked 21. At the plate, he hit .574 with five doubles, one triple and 24 RBIs. He

the mound, he had a 4.098 ERA. He struck out 44 and had a 3-2 record.

Garrett, a first baseman, hit .279 with 10 singles, eight RBIs and nine runs scored. In the field, he had just one error in 15 games.

Chapa, an outfielder, hit .357 for the season, driving in 13 runs and scoring 11 times as the Knights finished the season 7-4 overall. In the field, he committed just one

An infielder, Atkins hit .379 and scored a team-high 18 runs. He also hit four doubles and one triple.

Keefer, a third baseman, hit .429 with 15 hits, seven RBIs, nine runs scored and five stolen bases for the 5-9 Pirates.

A shortstop, Szasz hit .344 with 11 hits, three RBIs, eight runs

scored and eight stolen bases. Lorence was named to the 3A all-state second team, while Wilson was named to the third team. Chapa, Atkins, Garrett, Keefer and Szasz were selected to the honorable mention team.

Hermiston's Hottman sixth at The Outdoor **Nationals**

EUGENE — Hermiston's Caden Hottman threw a personal best 181 feet, 6 inches on Wednesday, June 30, to place sixth in the discus at The Outdoor Nationals at Hayward Field.

The meet, in its 30th year, features the top prep track and field athletes from throughout the nation.

Hottman, who will be a senior in the fall, hit his top throw on his second attempt. Hermiston track coach Emily Strot said the mark will replace Hottoman's previous school record of 178 feet.

Pendleton's Sam Jennings finished seventh in the javelin with a toss of 189-10, which was below his personal best of 207-10. Jennings hit the mark on his first

In the girls shot put, Hermiston's Bailey Young placed 28th with a throw of 38-7. Her personal best is $41-10^{3}/4$.
