During her marriage with Bill, when he traveled, she rode by his side, going to different states and abroad. Mary was the definition of adventurous. Family and friends would describe her as a selfless, caring and all-loving. She loved and cared for her grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and every person she had encountered; there was no ill bone in her body.
