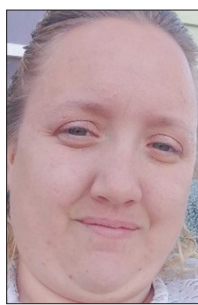


Keyonna Justine (Owens) Pace


