NTERPRISE — Emily Withnall, a writer and editor, will lead an online workshop on nature and environmental writing on Tuesdays in November, beginning Nov. 2 and continuing every Tuesday through Nov. 23.

This workshop, according to the Fishtrap website, "will flip traditional understandings of environmental writing by reading work that pushes the traditional boundaries of the genre. Readings, which will be largely completed outside of workshop sessions, will serve to help us redefine and reimagine environmental writing."

Each workshop session will include discussion of readings and ideas, brainstorming, and a generative prompt and writing time. By the end of the month, participants will have an essay drafted, as well as resources for revision and publication.

Withnall's work has appeared in Al Jazeera, Gay Magazine, The Kenyon Review, River Teeth, The Indiana Review, Fourth River, The Rumpus, Orion, and Ms. Magazine, among others. She is a recipient of the AWP Kurt Brown award in creative nonfiction, a John Anson Kittredge Foundation grant, and she has received fellowships from Fishtrap Summer Workshop and Under the Volcano
