Forest Service announces fee-free days for 2022

PORTLAND — Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Monday, Jan. 17, is the first recreation fee-free day of 2022 on U.S. Forest Service sites.

The fee waiver applies to most Forest Service day-use recreation sites in Oregon and Washington, including many picnic areas, boat launches, trailheads and visitor centers, according to a press release from the Forest Service. Fees for camping, cabin rentals or other permits still apply. Fees will continue to be charged at recreation sites operated by concessionaires unless the individual manager chooses to participate.

Recreation fee-free days are an effort to encourage people to get outside and enjoy public lands. The rest of the fee-free days for the year are:

LOCAL BRIEFING

- President's Day, Feb. 21.
- National Get Outdoors Day, June 11.
- National Public Lands Day, Sept. 24.
- Veterans Day, Nov. 11.

The Forest Service also reminded visitors to be prepared and cautious when visiting public lands this winter. While winter can be a wonderful time to visit your national forests, planning and caution are critical to ensure a safe and enjoyable trip.

Morrow County School District receives another clean audit

MORROW COUNTY — The Morrow County School District for the 10th consecutive year has received a clean report from their financial audit.

The district in a press release Tuesday, Jan. 11, reported the Pendleton firm of

Dickey and Tremper LLP conducted the audit, which the school board reviewed at its meeting Jan. 10.

The audit found the district carried a surplus of \$475,343 due to additional support from federal, state and local grants, including COVID-19 grants, according to the press release. The school district also carried an employee retirement reserve fund of almost \$1.45 million and did not spend any of the fund.

The district also repaid the voter-approved general obligation bond for capital improvement from 2001.

Morrow County School District Superintendent Dirk Dirksen in the press release said consistently receiving high marks for financial accountability is a credit to staff, the Intermountain Education Service District and the school board.
