Celebrating a milestone with a community party





HISTORY

When Side A opened, the brewery didn't serve its own beer.

"The process of converting an old firehouse into a restaurant is a serious undertaking, as well as converting a firetruck bay into a brewery," said Caiti Burke, event coordinator for Side A. "So, at the opening of the restaurant Side A had 10 guest brews on tap as placeholders until we had our own beer available to pour."

But the wait was only a few weeks, and Side A debuted Copper & Gold Strong Ale.

"Since then we have gone on to brew 75 different beers as well as our own cider, and even added two more taps to our bar to accommo-
