Benefit run/walk supports Worstell scholarship fund

HERMISTON — A scholarship fund has been established in the memory of Marissa Worstell. A 2011 Hermiston High School graduate, she was a member of the HHS cross country and track teams. Worstell died Nov. 3, 2020, at the age of 27.

To help raise money for the fund, a benefit run/walk is scheduled for May 14, 9 a.m. The registration fee is \$25 with 100% of the money raised going to the scholarship fund. It will begin/end at the front entrance at Hermiston High School, 600 S. First St. The event coincides with a celebration of life — on what would have been Worstell's 29th birthday — at 11 a.m. in the HHS Commons.

The Marissa Worstell Path to Change Memorial Scholarship fund is set up through the Hermiston Education Founda-

tion. It will be open to HHS students who show academic or vocational potential and due to their economic circumstances are not able to pay their total college costs.

As a HHS senior, Worstell received the Altrusa Young Citizens Award during the Hermiston Chamber of Commerce Distinguished Citizens Banquet. In addition to academic excellence, Worstell was active in student government, was a member of the Key Club, was crowned the 2010 homecoming queen and participated in many community service activities.
