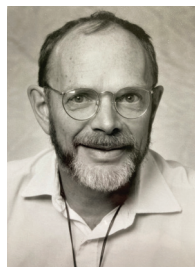

Their life together included as much time as possible outdoors — gardening, backpacking, owl watching, raising goats and a daughter, Jill.
