Here's a look at the schedule:

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 29

The activities begin mid-week with a movie in the park at 9 p.m. Everyone is welcome to bring a lawn chair or blanket and snacks.

THURSDAY, JUNE 30

A pickup Wiffle ball game starts at 5 p.m. in the park.
Everyone ages 12 and older is welcome to play — or just bring a lawn chair and watch the game.

All skill levels are welcome.

FRIDAY, JULY 1

This day gathers everyone together at 6:30 p.m. for a com-

munity potluck in the park, along with lawn games and a movie when it gets dark.

Those who plan to bring food are asked to follow these suggestions: for last names that start with letters A through J, bring a main dish; for last names K through R, bring side dishes or snacks; for last names from S to Z, bring a dessert.

Paper products, utensils, lemonade and tea will be provided.

Lawn games include horse

shoes, cornhole, croquet, outside Yahtzee and lawn darts.

SATURDAY, JULY 2

This day starts the city-wide yard sales, which run July 2-4.

Then, at noon, cooks are invited to join the Dutch oven cook-off at Ukiah City Park.
Organizers are asking a \$5 donation fee to enter, but this is not required. Food will be judged at 6 p.m., and there is a \$25 cash prize for first place.

A street dance starts at 7 p.m. between the Presbyterian Church and the park. There is no cost, although donations will be accepted.

MONDAY, JULY 4

A Fourth of July parade starts at 10 a.m. in front of the post office. Entries — horses, bicycles, ATVs, cars, trucks, etc. — are encouraged to decorate with red, white and blue.
