She delighted in taking young animals to nearby schools and retirement centers for students and residents to hold. Children who might not have had a Christmas without Myrna were on the receiving end of her generosity. As a devoted housewife and mom, she was kept busy transporting her four sons back and forth to baseball games, swim lessons, sledding and other activities. But she always provided a shoulder to lean on, and then her sons knew they were expected to listen to what she had to say, even if she could be a little bit stubborn and feisty.

After retiring from their business, Myrna and Bob built a home in Promise, where they lived until 2017 when they moved to Wallowa to be closer to doctors and friends. Myrna continued to be active in the Memorial Day Reunion every year in Promise and Wallowa.
