Former HSD employee sues over pandemic mandates

HERMISTON — A former Hermiston School District employee is suing the district for more than \$300,000, claiming discrimination for having to wear a mask due to pandemic safety measures.

Jennifer Morrell of Hermiston, who worked for the district for nearly 20 years, cites emotional damages and lost wages as reasons for the lawsuit. Attorney Brent Smith of La Grande filed the complaint for Morrell on June 17 in Umatilla County Circuit Court.

According to the document, Morrell notified the school on Dec. 7, 2020, about a medical condition that prevented her from wearing the state-required face mask. She and the district agreed she could wear a face shield

instead, and Morrell did so for nearly a year.

This changed in August 2021 when the Hermiston School District required vaccination for all employees, of which Morrell had "sincerely held religious beliefs which prevented her from receiving a COVID-19 vaccination," according to the complaint, which also questions the efficiency of COVID-19 vaccinations.

Medical studies have repeatedly demonstrated the vaccines are effective in preventing COVID-19 or decreasing the severity of the disease's symptoms.

Following meetings discussing her religious beliefs, the lawsuit accuses the district of offering only demotions in return. Morrell, who had recovered from COVID-19, claimed the response was not in line with the treatment other unvaccinated employees received. The lawsuit asserts
