BAKER CITY — For the first time since 2019, classic cars will fill Geiser-Pollman Park and cruise downtown streets.

The 30th annual Baker City Memory Cruise returns Saturday, Aug. 20.

"We hope to get 150, 175 cars," said Wayne Ryder, who has organized the event for years with Dan Haberman.

Jeron Simmons is also helping, and plans to continue the tradition in the future.

Ryder is not too worried that the price of gas will keep people away.

"There's more to life than gas mileage," he said.

Registration starts at 8 a.m. and continues through 10 a.m. at Geiser-Pollman Park. There's no need to pre-register. Entry is \$15.

"Show up, park your car and sign up," Ryder said.

The show-n-shine portion runs from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., and awards will be given out between 3 p.m. and 4 p.m.

A poker walk runs from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.,

and the poker run starts at 5 p.m.

Then, around dinner time, the classic cars will head to Quail Ridge Golf Course to park on the 9th fairway during the annual Durkee Steak Feed. The day ends with an informal cruise downtown, starting around 7 p.m.
