

### CONTRACTORS BACK JOHNSTON CHARGE

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., Jan. 24.—(AP)—Evidence purporting to show that road contractors rallied to the aid of Henry S. Johnston, suspended governor, when impeachment threatened him in 1927, was adduced today in a legislative investigation, as another article of impeachment was added to six already voted against him by the house.

Ten articles of impeachment against Johnston were placed before the house by its investigating committee. Three still await approval by the house before they can be transmitted to a senate court, before which Johnston must stand trial. The charge voted today involved the alleged illegal use of the national guard in suppressing an attempted impeachment session of the legislature last winter.

Testimony that Mrs. O. O. Hammond, the suspended governor's confidential secretary, had sought to arrange the intoxication of a hostile house member in an attempt to obtain information from him, was another high spot of the mass of evidence taken by committees of the senate and the house.

E. J. Franklin, Tulsa insurance agent, testified before a senate committee investigating rumors that money was employed to bring an end to the attempted impeachment session of December, 1927, that he contributed \$500 toward a fund to employ attorneys to represent Gov. Johnston in a supreme court case testing the validity of the session. He said the money had been solicited by two contractors, whose names he could not remember.

### TROTSKY FACTION PLANS REVOLUTION

MOSCOW, Jan. 24.—(AP)—The Communist party has declared relentless war against the party of Leon Trotsky, former minister of war who is in exile in Russia. Trotsky followers, here and elsewhere in Russian, and seized a quantity of so-called illegal literature.

It was stated in support of these severe measures that all of the anti-Soviet forces in the country were rallying around the Trotsky organization and preparing for a new civil war against the present government. It was charged that during 1928 the organization was directed against proletarian dictatorship and the Soviet Union and that Trotsky had published a statement abroad to the effect that the present Soviet government was "Kerenskyism turned inside out."

Secretary Jaroslavski of the central control commission in a speech today announced that the Soviet party and government intended definitely to end the counter-revolutionary activities which Trotsky is alleged to have carried on from his place of exile.

All arrested today were subjected to strict isolation. They included Mdivani, Globus, Drobnis, Pankratov, Kaviradze, Voronsky, Galevsky and Greenstein.
