THE ELECTION.—We regret our inability to publish in full this week the official election returns of Boise county. The law requires the returns to be opened by the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners within ten days, or sooner if all the returns are made before the expiration of that time. At the time of writing they have all been filed with one exception. The delay in the Grimes' Creek precinct (above Pioneer) prevents the publication of the precinct returns this week. Enough is known, however, of the result to insure the success of the democratic nominees by a majority of little over 600. Messrs. Dooley and Naeley ran ahead of their tickets at Buena Vista, Idaho and Placerville, and Goldtrap at Centerville. Idaho city gives 400 Democratic majority, Centerville about 34, Pioneer city 120, Tull Gate 32, Granite Creek 20, Pine Grove 60. Placerville went republican by 15, Buena Vista 36, Warm Springs 6, Horse Shoe Bend 7. The democratic majority would have been increased by fully 150 votes had the poles continued opened until sundown, as many working in the creek claims supposed, and acting accordingly, arrived at the polls too late to vote. The majority on the total vote cast is larger this year than at the last election. Alturas gives a democratic majority of about 200, Ada about 200, and Owyhee 140 majority. The returns insure the democracy two-thirds of both houses of the Legislature. Oneida is the only county in Southern Idaho to hear from. The Northern counties will probably increase the legislative majority. The vote in that section will be light. —Idaho World.

INJUSTICE TO A WORTHY PHYSICIAN.—On the 14th of this month, Dr. A. J. Mullan, of Walla Walla, was employed by the commanding officer at Fort Walla Walla, as physician to that post, in pursuance of an order, dated Fort Vancouver, August 9th, directing the employment of a suitable physician to supply the vacancy caused by Dr. Steinberger's being ordered to Vancouver. Dr. Mullan entered promptly upon his duties at the post. On Tuesday last, a Mr. Quiver, who has been in Weatherford's Drug Store, in Portland, and who, it is said, acknowledges that he is not a graduate of any medical college, was employed and Dr. Mullan discharged. It seems, however, that Col. Curry, at Vancouver, could not have possibly known that Dr. M. had been already employed, when this Mr. Quiver left Vancouver on his way up to Walla Walla. So the matter stands. We are personally acquainted with Dr. Mullan, and know him to be a gentleman of high attainments, and a physician of the first respectability. We shall be glad to hear that the Medical Department at Vancouver has inquired into this matter.
