STAGES FOR CALIFORNIA .- Captain Mallan has already put the new line in successful operation, running his stages tri weekly. W. F. & Co. now forward messengers over this route, the first one having left this week. Security has been obtained by the proprietor from Gen. McDowell for the safety of the stages along the road. Ten compunies of soldiers are now on their way to protect the route from Indian depredations. The stages connect at Chico with California Stage Company; at Sasanville, with stages to Virginia; and at Puebla with stages to Humboldt. Passengers are ticketed through from Boise City to San Francisco or Virginia. Fare from Boise City to Virginia \$75; to Humboldt \$65; to Chico \$75; to Sacramento \$85; and San Francisco \$90. The stages leaves Boise City regularly on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Passengers are allowed to lay over at every point on the road, and resume their journey at their own option. We understand the stages are running crowded with passengers, who express themsel es well satisfied with the trip. Idaho Slatesman.
