Atlantic News. New York, Oct. 28.—Rankin, alias Finch, the counterfeiter, was found guilty yesterday. During the trial the fact was elicited that nearly \$400,000 in counterfeit notes had been sent to Ohio and other Western States. Several counterfeits on the Mechanics' Bank of New Haven, and the Fishkill Bank, New York, were found on the premises. Fortness Monroe, Oct. 28.—The steamer Rock Island sailed for Havana to convey the old Shenandoah to Washington. The Elizabeth County Court is in session at Hampton, Va., under orders from Col. Miles. Washington, Oct. 28.—The Mexican Embassadors spent some time yesterday forenoon with the Secretary of State at his residence. They will be presented to the President on Monday. San Francisco, Nov. 1.—The overland line is still down. The case of Testroll vs. Maguire came up yesterday and was dismissed upon Maguire's promise not to put into execution the threats he had made. The United States Internal Revenue officer of this post has released the ninety seven cases of matches belonging to Messrs. Ellis & Co., that were seized last July as they were about being shipped to the Sandwich Islands, on account of their not being stamped. Costs paid by the United States.

SUMMIT FLAT, IN THE BOISE MINES.—The quartz mines in the mountains adjacent to Summit Flat, which is located on the head of Grimes' Creek, in the Boise mines, were discovered in the Summer of 1863. Three lodes were discovered and located by two men named King and Flannagan. In the Winter of 1863-4 Flannagan died and his interest was bought by King and an associate by the name of Miller. These men erected an eight-stamp mill, driven by water, on Grimes' Creek, and in the Fall of 1864 sold out the entire mining property to Messrs. Humason, Bibb & Jackson. It consisted of the discovery claims and King's and Flannagan's claims on the "Mammoth," "Specimen" and "King" lodes—six hundred feet each. The first lode is located about three miles below where the first tributaries of Grimes' Creek flow out of the Grimes Creek Mountains; the other two are nearly on top of those mountains, facing the creek of the same name. The "Mammoth" lode is about four feet wide on an average, and the "King" and "Specimen" near two feet each. They all yield gold of great fineness, and the precious metal is free in the rock, and visible, so regularly is it distributed, in nearly every piece of the quartz which may be examined. The average yield of rock from the "Mammoth" is near \$60 a ton; from the "Specimen" and "King" it is about \$90. The water mill was put up near the "Mammoth" lode, and the owners are now erecting a new eight-stamp steam mill by the other two lodes. They are also running an adit to strike the "King" at a considerable depth, to facilitate the extraction of the ore. The ores from this mines are of the same character as the "Landon" and "Chickahominy," near Idaho City, and in fact the evidences are in favor of the theory that they all belong to the same formation. These mines are distant twelve miles from Pioneer City in an easterly direction, and about the same distance north of Idaho City.

Lo, THE POOR INDIAN, AGAIN!—The Idaho Statesman, of October 28th, says that there were fifty-eight horses and mules stolen from Camp Lyon, in Stein's Valley, by the Snakes a few days before. All of them but twenty-seven head were recovered. The Indians crossed the Owyhee and took up a long cañon, where pursuit was abandoned by the party of fourteen men that had gone after them. Mr. T. J. FAVORITE has issued a prospectus for a democratic paper to be published at Helena, Montana Territory, to be called the Montana Radiator. The material formerly in use at the office in Lewiston is now ten days on the road to Montana. Ten teams from the Dalles to Boise City have arrived in safety at their destination. They belong to Mr. McLeary. HIRAM KURTZ has been indicted in Boise for the murder of a Chinaman.
