The war created an artificial prosperity, which, although well enough for the individuals who ' made hay while the sun shone,' was factitious and unreal, so far as the country was concerned." A NEW RELIGIOUS MOVEMENT. - A singular religious movement was be gun in England a few weeks ago. It is proposed to unite the members of the English, Roman Catholic and Greek churches in friendly communion' and the public journals report that three hundred churches in Eng-land have assented to the measure. The institution is formed under the title of "The Association for the Promotion of the Unity of Christendom," to unite in a bond of intercessory prayer among members. They are not to compromise any principles which they, rightly or wrongly, hold

dear ; they are simply asked to nulte for the promotion of a high and boly end. The names of the members are to be kept strictly private, and the only ob igntion imposed upon those who join the association is the daily use of a short form of prayer, to which is added, in the case of priests, the offering, at least once in three months, of the Holy sacrifice.
