RELICS OF A NAVIGATOR.—The *Colonist* says that M. W. V. Brown, one of the party of prospectors under Captain Torrens, who recently returned from prospecting for gold at Nootka Sound, has found some most interesting relics of the visit of the great navigator, Captain James Cook, to the western coast of this island. On the prospectors leaving Guyquina Arm, in Nootka Sound, in a whale-boat to return to Victoria, it appears that they camped for night in Resolution Inlet (so called from the name of Capt. Cook's ship;) while here the party discovered a cluster of well made bricks, which had evidently been earthed over for many years, but had been left bare by the heavy rains that had fallen. From inquiries made of the natives, our informant says they gathered, that many years ago, according to the statement of their forefathers, a number of King George men had visited the Inlet, and remained there some time, and that it was these early visitors who had these left traces of civilization. The bricks were probably used for building a chimney for a blacksmith's forge, as we read in the narrative of Cook's voyages that the *Resolution* and *Discovery* went into the Inlet in March 1778, and underwent repairs, Captain Cook and his officers being engaged in the meantime in visiting every port of the Sound, trading with the Indians and making scientific observations.
