THE ADMINIRTRATION POLICX OF
RECONSTRUCTION. It was universally conceded at the beginning of our civil struggle that the United States did not make war on the Confederate States to acquire new power in the southern section of the Union, but to vindicate rights expressed in the Constitation. No circumstance has since occarred, except the effect of war on the institution of African slavery, Which in any manner affects the measure of
rights and powers which raspectively rights and powers, which raspectively inure to
the Geneneral Government, and the governments of the various States. The theory of our Government is such that the States mast all be equal in the Government, or the not be one rule for South Carolina and another for Massachusetts, and the attempt to institute such distinotions must, sooner or tater, result in war-terrible and desolating
The offenses of sccessionists in the late war were agnisst the General Goverument, and not against the States. The pardon of of fenders agninst the National Government
 What is now called pardon is simply amnesty,
or oblivion. Amnesty precedes conviction,
in a general way, and pardon, in a legal sense, can only be given after conviction is procured. The ex-rebels who are now experiencing the clemency of the Eresident are receiving am-
