IMMIGRANTS AND THE NATCHES ROAD.—Mr. T. R. Berry, writing from Walla Walla on the 18 ult., says that thirty teams had crossed the Columbia river at Wallula for Puget Sound. Whether they will come through, or be induced to turn back and go to Oregon, remains to be seen. Our people can congratulate themselves that they so well succeeded in opening the road, and that a few emigrants have come in by that route, and amply demonstrated its feasibility. Opposition to the road, we regret to say, has been waged from the first, not only from Oregonians and people east of the mountains, but from persons living on the Sound, through sheer jealousy, and it has been kept up since the completion of the road, in the circulation of false reports among the immigrants and turning them to Oregon. We have positive evidence that the impression was assiduously spread at Walla Walla that the route was impracticable. There have been a few persons, however, east of the mountains, who have endeavored to counteract this malicious effort, to whom all credit should be given. A gentleman who left Van Ogle's yesterday week informs us that there were a few teams in the mountains which were expected in soon.—Standard.

NATIONS WITHOUT FIRE.—According to Pliny, fire was for a long time unknown to some of the Egyptians; and when Euxodus (the celebrated astronomer,) first showed it to them, they were absolutely in rapture. The Persians, Phœnicians, Greeks and several other nations acknowledge that their ancestors were without the use of fire, and the Chinese confess the same of their progenitors. Pompanus Mela Plutarch and other ancient authors, speak of nations, who, at the time they wrote knew not the use of fire, or but just learned it. Facts of the same kind are also attested by several modern nations. The inhabitants of the Marian Islands, which were discovered in 1551, had no idea of fire. Never was astonishment greater than theirs when they saw it on the descent of Magellan in one of their islands. At first they believed it was some kind of animal that fixed to and fed upon wood. The inhabitants of the Philippino and Canary Islands were formerly equally ignorant. Africa at the present, even in our day, is in the same state.

PRINTING PAPER MADE FROM BAMBOO.—It is stated that the Albany Journal is now printing on paper made from bamboo. The bamboo is brought from Jamaica, where it is produced in unlimited abundance, and costs, delivered here from ten to twelve dollars per cord. It is cut into five feet lengths, conveyed to manufactory, where it is soaked in warm water for a time: it is then put in steam guns of the form of ordinary cannon, where it is thoroughly saturated with steam and then exploded, under an immense pressure, which tears it into fibres. When thus torn it is placed in an immense pulping boiler, where it is boiled under a pressure of sixty pounds to the inch, and from thence blown into a receiving tank. It is then perfect pulp, ready to be made into paper.

THE BURIAL PLACE OF WIKES BOOTH. A correspondent recently visited the U. S. arsenal at Washington, and thus describes the supposed sepulchre of J. Wilkes Booth: "Entering the lower rooms of the prison, and passing through devious halls formed by piles of cartridge boxes, we came at length to what seemed to be a solid wall, against which was piled ammunition, but through an aperture, on shoving aside a heavy plank, an empty, floorless room, in one corner of which the loosened earth indicated the burial place of the foulest assassin of the time."
