PROGRESS OF THE NEW OVERLAND TELEGRAPH.—The Salt Lake Union Vedette, of October 31st, says:

This new lightning line, with double wires, from the far west to east, will be in working order before mid-summer next judging from the present progress made and effected through Mr. Street, the manager, who has concluded contracts for the portions of the line between the Bay and the Missouri, since his advent here from San Francisco. The poles are now all up between San Francisco and Virginia, Nevada. At least they were to have been up, on the 30th instant, yesterday, by arrangement of the General Superintendent, Mr. Gamble, with the six parties, contractors for the said division. From Virginia City to Austin, Reese River, the contract for putting up the poles has been let to J. W. Coleman, one of the oldest telegraph men in the far West. He agrees to have his part completed by the 1st of January next. From Austin to Schell Creek, Messrs. Griswold & Woodward, of Ruby Valley, have received the contract, and the poles are to be forwarded by the 1st of June, a distance of 154 miles. From Schell Creek to Denver, (via Salt Lake City) the contract has been made with Brigham Young, who agreed to have that section built by August 1st next. From Denver to the Missouri River, the contract has been given to James Creighton, over part of which line his own poles are stretched, so that, we might say, a portion of the above sub-division is already made. From Fort Kearney to Atchison and St. Louis, there will be a divergent line by this company; and from Kearney to Omaha, another to connect with Chicago. The line will be in working order from this town to San Francisco by the 1st of June next. James Street has met with good success here, contracting and making arrangements. Finding the party here that he wanted, Mr. Creighton, he was not obliged to go on further east; hence his return to-day to the Pacific.

A GOOD PRACTICE.—For a great number of years, it has been the custom in France to give to young females of the earliest age the habit of holding back the shoulders, and thus expanding the chest. From the observation of anatomists, lately made, it appears that the clavicle, or collar bone, is actually longer in females of the French Nation than in those of the English. As the two nations are of the Caucasian race as there is no other remarkable difference in their bones, and this is peculiar to the sex, it may be attributed to the habit above mentioned, which, by the extension of the arms has gradually produced a national elongation of this bone: Thus we see that the habit may be employed to alter and improve the solid bones. The French have succeeded in the development of a part that adds to health and beauty.

SENATOR SHERMAN.—Senator Sherman spoke at Springfield (Ohio) on the 3d of October. A resolution having been adopted at the Senatorial District Convention in favor of Gen. Schenck as his successor in the Senate of the United States, Sherman denounced proceedings against particular persons in the canvass as extraordinary and tending directly to the defeat of the Union cause. He reviewed his own career, declaring his belief that Lincoln did right to call out 75,000 men in 1861 and blockade the Southern ports, but that he had no legal power to suspend the writ of habeas corpus. He was opposed to the repeal of the Fugitive Slave law of 1793, and so, he said, was Lincoln. He had opposed the repeal of the duty on paper, but hoped the internal revenue tax would be lightened.
