Gold Garki, Mostana Thatitory.-Gold Creek, or Amerienn Fork, is the name of a tributary of Hellgate River, which come into that stream from the west side, abou twelve miles below the Little Blackfoot. Crossing the Bitter Root Mountana, one hu fixty miles to Fort Owen, he follewed then down the Biter Root River, thirty miles to Hellgate, and seventy-five miles up the Hellgate River to Gold Creek. Twenty days had elapsed and the thieves felt safe from pursuit. When Bull arrived in the camp, he ealled upon a trader, to whom he had letter explaining his errand, and from him learned that the men were at that time in a neigh boring driaking-house. Hastily loading doulle-barreled shotgun, Bull, accompanied by the friend who had attended him from Elk City, went over to the drinking-honse This establishment was a low, bewn-log cabin, with a thatched roof, and here wor
the long sought villinas who had set bin $a$-foot. One of them saw Bull, as he came up, and immediately jumped upon a horse, which was hitched to the corral and fled. The other whose name was Bill Arnett, wns dealing a game of monte. As Bull entered the door, Arnett recognized him. Springing to his feet, with his cards in one hand, with the other hand be reached for his pistolBut Bull was too quiek for him and brought him to the ground dead, with two charges of buck-shot and slags. The other man was pursued atout ten miles down the river-caught-brought bick, and hung on a gal-
lows hastily improvised by two logs luid over the top of the corral, with a cro s piece tied on it. Both were baried in a clump of bushes near by, which grew around a stagnant water bole, and Arnett was laid in the grave wi h the monte cards sill grasped in bis thnd.
