THE GREAT VALUEY OF THE PAYETTE -The Great V lley of the Payette, is a name commonly given to a large body of agricultual lands lying along the Lake Fork of the Pay. ette, a stream which rises just south of Warren's Diggings, and flows due south to the Payette River, about twenty miles above Horseshoe Bend. Its geographical location is between the meridians of 115° and 116° west from Greenwich, and the parallels of 44° and 45° 30' north. On the east, running nearly parallel to the Lake Fork, from south to north, is the West Fork of Salmon River; and on the west, running from north to south, is the Weiser River. The great valley is bemmed in on all sides by high mountains, having gentle slopes, partially covered with a growth of pine, fir, laurel and other trees and shrubs, with bright streaks of grass intermixed; but to get out or to the waters of the rivers which bound its flowage east and west, terribly pre cipitous mountains must be descended. The valley drains through an impassable caffon into the main stream, and at its north end there is a convenient pass over on to Little Salmon. The average width of the arable land, from east to west, may be seven miles, and from north to south, its length is eighty miles. About half way of its length there is a ridge of a hundred feet in beight, with open, grassy slopes, which divide the valley into what is called the upper and lower valleys. Either of these has the same verdant, lakelike level, and the course of the Lake Fork through the whole length of this magnificent stretch of lands, is marked by a fringe of cottonwood, alder and willow.

In July the landscape is embellished with a great variety of bright colored flowers, and the waving meadws, the rustling cortonwoods, the dark firs and evergreen pines, with long, quiet vistas up grass-grown slopes, or between verdant creek bottoms, joined to the splendld colors with which nature loves to paint the face of the earth, presents to the wearied eye, blurred with looking on man's artificialities, a scene which strikes upon the senses, with spring-like freshness. Coming from the south, the Boise and Lewiston trail runs up the valley, and towards its head, the mountain ridge towards the east towers up into isolated groups of crags of chalky whiteness, which present a curious resemblance in shape to the flat, fan 1 k. cactus, so much used for fences in California and Mexico. If the traveler will ascend the mountain slopes to the east, he will have a view far down beneath him of the bare, granite cofions out of which flow the western waters of the West Fork of Salmon From a point nearly opposite the head of the great valley, he can look along an almost perpendicular barrier of white granite, a thousand feet Ligh, down which there is no path, save for the ibex, and at the foot of this crag are seen many little lakes, which no wind ever ruffl s-fringed to the edge with dark firs, which are mirrored in the polished surface of the water, in their native colors.

THE CHINESE IN BOISE. - The prejudice against the Cuinese laborers has so far abated in the Boise mines, that they are now allowed to pur hase mining ground and work it. Three years ago, a Chinaman was looked upon with abomination in that country, but the existence of a vast extent of placers which the white miners could not afford to work, produced a demand for cheaper labor, which was only to be obtained by the introduction of the irrepressible John. There are vast treasures lying in the sands of Clearwater, Salmon, Sauke, Payette, Boise and Columbia rivers which require only the indefatigable Chinaman's labor to be dug out, and put in scirculation. But there is a prejudice against him which it requires time to modify or destroy. In the absence of a candid discussion of the advantages and disadvantages attend ing the employment of these people, an important branco of placer-mining is almost dormant, and millions of money that might be swelling the volume of the currency of the country, is resting in the places where nature
