EASTERN CAPITAL IN THE OREGON MINES.—A very handsome sum, said to be as high as \$300,000, has been offered by New York capitalists for the Ruckel mine, formerly known as the Rockfellow, and situated on Powder River, Oregon. The property consists of a 10-stamp quartz mill, driven by water power, with an average crushing capacity of fifteen tons per day. The ledge is located on the emigrant road about seven miles from the mill, and ore is hauled at a cost of \$5 per ton. There are several distinct lodes from which the mill is supplied. There is but little wood or water at the mines; but a great abundance of alkali. The mine was discovered by some old miners as they were passing by on the road. There are good "indications" at intervals for a distance of several miles along the outcrop of this lead. There are also several parallel ledges. The rock contains but little pyritous ore; the gold being mostly free. The main lead was struck by a tunnel 110 feet from the surface, and 116 feet from the point where it was commenced. About twenty-five men are employed about the mine. Col. Ruckel, late president of the Oregon Steam Navigation Company, is the principal owner of the ledge, the work upon which is under the management of Capt. Coffin, formerly of the California Steam Navigation Company.

Wood & Fogus' interest in the Morning Star gold and silver ledge, Owyhee, has been conditionally sold through, or to, a prominent New York banker, for \$800,000. Wilson Waddingham has purchased the interest of the White Brothers in the Confederate Star and Idaho, Alturas county, for \$25,000, and is in treaty for other valuable ground. Mr Waddingham has been extremely fortunate in his quartz operations, and is now the proprietor of several of the richest ledges in Idaho. During his late visit to the Eastern States he has not only realized a fortune, but justly earned for himself the character of an upright and honorable man. His fair and impartial representation of the quartz interest has been of incalculable benefit to Idaho, and entitles him to the good wishes of all who desire to see Oregon and Idaho flourish. Mr. Waddingham's success in forming a company in New York affords very good evidence that the miners of Oregon need entertain no further fear that they will want for capital to fully develop the country.—*Mining and Scientific Press.*

NO PROSCRIPTION ON ACCOUNT OF OPINION.—Senator Wilson, at a Republican meeting in Philadelphia, recently, said: "A day or two ago I saw President Johnson, there are differences of opinion in regard to negro suffrage. In my State we are all one way. We are all for security for the future. We do not ask any indemnity for the past. There is no indemnity for the 325,000 dead heroes who lie under the sod of Southern battle-fields. There is no indemnity for the widow and orphans—none! We cannot forgive their murderers, but we want security that our sons shall not be murdered in the future. We want loyal men to govern America forevermore. I asked the President if he made any discrimination among the men who elected him on account of their views on suffrage or on reconstruction. The President said he had never made any such distinctions, and never intended to make any in the future—that he was in favor of the freest and fullest discussion of all the questions now arising before us. And so long as we can go right on, shoulder to shoulder, arguing, discussing and examining the questions that are before us to be solved, and I believe now, as I did during the war, that we will solve these questions right, and that our country will come out in future glorious and free."
