THE AP PROACHING COMET .- The comet now making its way towards the earth is known as Biela's comet, and has on several occasions passed near enough to the earth to be seen. The elements of its orbit and the period of its re-olution around the sun were calculated by M. Biela in 1826. The path of this comet passes very near that of the earth-so near that the matter of the comet includes a part of the earth's (rbit at one time. It was predicted that this comet would collide with the earth in 1832, and that our planet would be blotted out of the solar system, but the comet crossed our orbit on the 29th day of of October, and the earth did not are rive at the point where the collision was to have occurred until 32 days after-just 52 millions of miles behind time. This comet makes its revolution around the sun in about six and three-fourths years. It may now be seen with the aid of an ordinary glass, and will be visible to the naked eye in a short time. On the first of November it will, on its way to its perihelion, approach the bright star Markab, (Alpha Pagas,) one of the four bright stars that form the square of Pegasus. Then pursuing a southerly course, it will cross the Celestial equator about the middle of December, cross its old path of 1846, near where it separated into two comets, and the end of February, its presumed nearest approach, its distance from the earth will be something less than twenty millions of miles. The above state ments are founded on scientific authority. These visitors have ever been a terror to the superstitious, and their approach has been looked upon as a sign of war, pestilence and famine. It is held by some that these bodies eventually fall into the sun and become a part of that luminary. Whence they come and their destination, as well as the nature of their physical organizations and their uses, are inquiries which surpass the limited power of the human mind. Time and science may in the future unveil the mystery in which these strange bodies are enveloped.

NEW MINERAL. - A new mineral of lead has been discovered in Chili, containing ten per cent of iodine. Iodine has lately became very valuable, on account of its extensive use in photography, and of the discovery, by Dr. Hoffman, of a new dye, having this element amongst its constituents. It is said that one cargo of this new mineral will represent a fortune. As a further illustration of the progress that mining adventure is making in Southern America, a mine of bismuth has recently been opened in Bolivia, about two-thirds of the way up the highest of all the peaks of the Andes-the Iljampu Mountain. Bismuth, has lately insressed in value; and filteen thousand feet above the level of the ocean, only slightly beneath the line of perpetual snow, men are setting to work to obtain it.
