LETTER FROM BAKER CITY.

BAKER CITY, Nov. 23d, 1865. EDITOR MOUNTAINEBR : - Our little town, which has been established since the erection of Col. Ruckle's quartz mill, is growing rapidly. We have a number of stores, a hotel, butcher shop post and express offices, and many new dwelling houses are being built. Three stages pass through daily on their way to Boise and Owyhee. The Thomas & Ruckle road, via Warm Springs is fast becoming the favorite road, and from experience, I must say has a decided advantage over all others, and is destined to be the main traveled one this winter. The government train passed over it a few days since, and although there have been heavy rains in the mountaiús, the wagon-master said it is far the best road.

Col. Ruckle has been here for the past ten days, giving his personal attention to the working of his mill and lode, which are now working splendidly, and the ore coming from the depth of 130 feet is very rich. The men at work on the lode-who visit this town every Sunday to spend their loose changesay that the lode is growing richer as they go down, and that when they strike in the lower tunnel, at the depth of 250 feet, they anticipate the richest results ever known. Thirty-seven pounds of amalgam were taken out from the two upper plates a few days since, without disturbing the batteries, which are now pounding every day and night, and the Colonel intends to keep them thumping until the ice stops the mill, which probably will not be for two or three weeks to come, as the weather continues very

The farmers are now preparing their ground with the anticipation of raising heavy crops next season. RAMON.

THE PORTLAND AND SACRAMENTO MAIL .-The Oregonian announces that Col. Markland, the Special Postal Agent, intends to report in favor of the reduction of the service between Portland and Sacramento to a weekly mail, after June next. Without calling in question the importance of the daily mail to the people adjacent to the route, we must protest against the idea gaining circulation that it is looked upon as a necessity by any person living in the Columbia Basin, unless that individual has interests in the Willamette. So far from its being correct, it is looked upon as an absolute injury to the best interests of the entire interior. Neither does it serve, in the delivery of mail matter or passengers, any part of Montana, Idaho or Eastern Oregon. As we have before shown, it carries the mails from seven to fourteen days out of the direct line of travel; it carries to and through California persons whose original destination is the mines on the waters of the Columbia, and continually militates against the general interest of our section. If the service is to be continued for the benefit of the Willamette Valley and the partially depopulated district of Northern California, we find no objection, but it will be hard to procure an endorsement of a mail route from the people to the east of us, which is of no practical value to them, not to say, from some points of view, an actual injury. If the commercial elements of population in this section of country will move for a new through line by the northern route, they will be doing something which will subserve the common instead of a local interest; and thus bring to its support the antire community. Unless this is done, the privation of our neighbors, in the loss of the daily mail, will be looked upon with an entire indifference, and we shall prove that it was of no interest to us, by being rather pleased than otherwise that it has been given up.

LAKE SUPERIOR AND PUGET SOUND RAILROAD. A late dispatch from Montreal, Canada, says "Col. Rowland as Commissioner of the Northern Pacific Railroad Company, is here confer-ring with the Canadian Government and others, relative to uniting British capital with the grants of the United States in the construction of a Lake Superior and Puget Sound Railroad. Col. Rowland is confident the commercial influence of Canada will be most fully accorded to this project as one of great national importance to the people of both countries, and he has no doubt his mission will be crowned with success."
