The Liberals have authentic information that three weeks ago the Imperialists were reduced to one-third rations, and they are completely cut off from Vera Cruz and Tampico. His troops were divided in three bodies to capture Morelia, and so they were beaten in detail and dispersed, 400 prisoners remaining in the hands of the Imperialists. Rev. J. P. Morris who declared that he could not take the oath, and any man who could was a black hearted traitor to the South, was elected to Congress from Madison District.
