THE PRESIDENT'S POLICY.—The subjoined extract is from the Nevada Gazette, and is about as sensible a view of the aims of extremists as we have

The Sacramento Union says the "result of the election in North Carolina will gratify all the original opponents of the President's generous and lenient policy!" We have no doubt that it will, and the same men would be more gratified still if the rebellious spirits in the South would organize another war. Anything that will keep up turmoil and trouble in the country, and postpone the settlement of questions growing out of the rebellion, will gratify the opponents of the President's policy. Nothing gratifies them more than the continued manifestations of a rebellious spirit in the South, and they have done, and are still doing everything in their power to keep alive the antagonism of the sections, for no other purpose that we can imagine, but to force the Government to continue the military rule in the South. The extremists of the two sections played into each other's hands for years, until they succeeded at last in involving the country in a civil war, and now that the war is ended they continue the same game with the view if possible of plunging the whole country into a state of anarchy. The men who are continually denouncing the President's policy would never be sat-isfied unless the South would conform in all particulars to their peculiar ideas. To what extent the President's policy may be indorsed by Congress will, of course, depend much on circumstances; but that it will be substantially approved, we have no doubt. Each House will be the judge as to what members of Congress shall be admitted from the different Southern States. Many who have been elected cannot be admitted, for they have taken part in the rebellion and cannot take the oath required. But the mere fact that some are excluded on that account will be no reason for excluding others from the same States who are qualified.

A STEAMSHIP PROJECT .- The Walla Walla Statesman of the 24th contains a letter from the Dalles, from which we extract the following :

Late advices from New York report the organization of a Joint Stock Company, to take charge of the steamship business on the Pacific Coast. The new organization is to be known as "The California, Oregon and Mexican Mail Steamship Company," and to have a capital stock of \$2,000,000, of which Ben Holladay retains two-thirds; the remainder being taken by the other directors. The Board is composed as follows: Paul S. Forbes, the eminent ship owner of New York, John Bell, Samuel S. L. Barlow, Capt. W. L. Dall, of California, (formerly commander of the Northerner,) John E. Russell and Ben Holladay. The Company have already purchased the side wheel steamer Oriflamme, now supposed to be on her way to San Francisco from China. This vessel is quite new, is of the same size of the Sierra Nevada, with less draught of water, and reputed to be very fast. Another vessel of the same character is to be built by the Company.

With little exertion on the part of our business men east of the Cascades, the new Company could be induced to land their steamers at Astoria, and discharge at that point the freights des-tined for the Columbia River. The Oregon Steam Navigation Company would also hail with joy this new en-terprise, and run a daily line of steamers between the latter place and the Cascades. This would not only have the effect of saving shippers to Idaho and Walla Walla the lighterage tax and reshipping at the "Emporium," but would also lessen the rates of freights \$10 per ton.
