Atlantic News.

New York, Nov. 17.—Advices from Toronto to the evening of November 16th, state that the excitement has somewhat subsided. The troops are still under arms, and have patrols out.

The Times' special dispatch says : Application was made to day to the Navy Department by Ethan Allen, of New York, in behalf of the Russian & American Overland Telegraph Company, for a naval vessel to aid in laying the cable across Behring's Straits. The applicaof the Navy, on the ground that it was exclu

sively a private enterprise.

New York, Nov. 17.—The World's Washington dispatch says, intelligence was received to day and communicated to the proper au-thorities relative to the situation in Mexico. A gentleman who arrived here whose word can be vouched for, says that on his way from Tobasco to New York, within the last two he met an agent of Maximilian, who stated that affairs were nearly in a desperate condition; that every reported victory of the Imperialists brought no substantial results, and that on account of their loability to draw supplies from the rural districts, the war was carried on against the Liberals at a deal of expense. He further added, that he had been despatched by Maximilian to France to ask for a hundred million dollars and forty thousand troops, and that in the event of Napoleon failing to furnish means and men the evacuation of Mexico by the French must follow. milian was paying a visit to Yucatan, but had removed his personal effects to that place, intending to set sail from there in case the City of Mexico had to be abandoned. It was reported that he was shipping a good deal of

specie to Europe.

New Orleans, Nov. 16.—The Brownsville Republican extra of Nov. 6th, says Gen. Pedro Mendrero had arrived and joined Carido, before Matamoras, with 1,800 Liberals. He had previously surprised the town of Suicaque, and utterly destroyed the Imperial garrison of one hundred men, including a number of French troops.

The Liberals claim that they can take Mat-

amoras when they please.

The Matamoras Ranchero says the Liberals offered four hours for the plunder of Matamoras to United States troops at Brownsville, who are asked to join them. That paper warps the Federal commander to keep a sufficient force at Brownsville to prevent an at-

The Galveston Bulletin, of Nov. 13th, says: Col. Jones, of Gea. Sobedo's staff was there, having left Brownsville Nov. 8th. He says that Capt. Sinclair, of the Liberal army, for-merly a Lieutenant of the privateer Alabama, captured an Imperial transport on the North Rio Grande, brought her to Brownsville and turned her over o the Federal authorities, who have a guard on board.

In Texas the Indians have created a great alarm on the northern frontiers.

Governor Hamilton will soon issue an or-der for the election of delegates to a State Conventian, to be held about the 15th of De-

The Houston Telegraph, of November 10th, learns that orders have been received in the State from Washington, not to muster out any more troops or sell any more property until further orders.

A wealthy Matamoras merchant, who left there Nov. 7th, says there are no fears of the place being captured. It is well fortified, the troops are well armed, in good spirits, and

well supplied.

New York, Nov. 17 — The firmness of gold which closed to day at 147, excites a corresponding feeling in commsrcial circles. As a general thing markets are buoyant and firm. Foreign goods are steady at improved prices. Flour and wheat are firm. Pork in sellers' tavor. Stocks lower. The steadiness of U. Washington, Nov. 17 .- The Virginia correspondence of the National Intelligencer says Curtis, Chandler, Rogers, Barbour and Davis, are elected to Congress and will take the oath without scruple. It is not known whether the other two, Stuart and Conrad will be able to

take the oath prescribed.

New York, Nov. 17th.—The Commercial's Washington special says Gen. Logan has signified his acceptance of the mission to Mexico.
