MR. JOHNSON AS PRESIDENT.-Some politicians who have attempted to bully President Johnson have found him rather rough, but that is by no means his general demeanor. A correspond-ent of the Philadelphia Press compares him with his predecessors and says:

Each President, in my remembrance has had peculiarities. Mr. Pierce for instance, was a most courteous gentleman. Buchanan was, in manners, as in heart, an iceberg. Mr. Lincoln was genial, but it is said that towards the last he was sometimes irritable. There is no wonder in this. Four years in the White House would irritate an angel. But, so far, Mr. Johnson is successful in pleasing all. He, I believe, generally receives standing, but in a minute or two requests you to be seated. He listens with no sign of impatience, and makes business like replies. There is no attempt to impress you with the grandcur of the position—easy and agreeable you at once feel at home. There is no reticence. He may ask your opinion on the great questions of the day, and frankly he will tell you his own. Beyond all question he is honest, patriotic and most anxious to see peace, prosperity and happiness once again in all parts of our wide country. The only apprehension I have is that his natural goodness of heart will be imposed up. on by the false friends and flatterers always hovering around power. Yet I have no doubt if the time should come, and I think it will, when he should be stern and unyielding in what he conceives to be right and best, he will show that he has some, at least, of the mettle of him who sleeps beneath the sod.

NEW MAIL ROUTES .- The Avalanche of November 18th, contains the fol-

lowing:
Hill Beachey, Esq., has forwarded two bids to the P. O. Department to carry the U. Mails from Humboldt City, Nevada, to Boise City, Idaho Territory. One to cover the time till June 30, 1866, and one for the subsequent four years. His bonds are amply sufficient, and accompanied the proposals. He expects a reply from the P. O. Department by telegraph, and, if his proposals are accepted, he will immediately enter upon the service. His bids are as low as the service can be performed for, and we urge it upon those who represent Nevada and Idaho interests in Congress to use their utmost exertions to have Mr. Beachey's proposals accepted. There is not a more energetic man in the country than him, and if any man can, the mails will be carried promptly by him. This line will bring us within six and seven days of San Francisco, and from two to three from the telegraph at Star City, instead of fifteen to twenty from the former and six to eight from the latter, as we now are. The Nevada Senators and Representative will consult the interests of their State as well as our Territory, by giving prompt and earnest aid towards awarding this contract to Mr. Beachey.

Register has been informed that Mr. Bovie, who has been engaged in building a mill near town, has perfected a process of reducing quartz so as to extract all the gold from the rock. It is done by means of heated steam, which is brought into contact with the rock and slackens it as water slackens lime. He has made a practical test of a lead situated in Angels, which has been worked, but which never could be made to pay over three dollars per ton. The Register is told by this process this same rock yields five hundred dollars a ton. If this is correct, it is destined to bring about a revoltion in quartz mining, which will make this one of the richest sections in the State; for by this process nearly every lead in the county will pay .- Sacramento
