SOUTHERN POLITICS.—Under date of October 20th, the correspondent of a Philadelphia paper wrote from Washington:

We have most encouraging reports from the South, with reference to the representatives nominated, and those to be nominated for the next session of Congress. Almost, if not quite, to a man, they will be able to take the "test" oath of 1862, and this will disarm the radical power at once. The South is not too blind to see that the game is in its own hands, and it is acting cautiously in the matter of its nominations to make sure that every one (in the language of old Zach Taylor) is "fit to be made." No clearer proof of the determination of the South to be represented could be offered than the spontaneous and unselfish withdrawal of all from the canvass who cannot meet the "danger" at the threshold, and the giving place to those against whom the radical shafts will dash in vain.

TURNING TOBACCO ASHES TO ACCOUNT.—The schooner Severn has sailed from Richmond for Baltimore with a cargo of five thousand four hundred bushels of tobacco ashes. The ashes are the net result of the tobacco smoked up in the big pipe of the evacuation conflagration. It was gathered from the debris of the tobacco warehouses burned. The ashes will be turned to account by the cute Northern farmer as a fertilizer of the soil, as it is well known that ashes of any kind, and especially tobacco ashes, possess fertilizing qualities not second to either lime or guano.—*Richmond Whig.*

HUGH WILLIAMS, THE INEVITABLE.—An exchange says: "In the year 1664, on the 5th of December, a boat crossing the Menai Straits, with eighty-one passengers, was upset, and only one of the passengers, a man named Hugh Williams, was saved. On the same day, in the year 1785, another boat was upset, containing about sixty passengers, and every person perished with the exception of one, whose name was Hugh Williams; and the on 5th of August, 1820, a third met the same disaster, but the passengers of this were no more than twenty-five; and, singular to relate, the whole perished with the exception of one, whose name was Hugh Williams."

THE PRESIDENT'S POLICY.—President Johnson's policy thus far has been eminently judicious, wise and just, and no less faithful to principle. He has not done all things precisely as we would have done them, but he has acted firmly and honestly, though cautiously, and he has given us no reason to fear that he will surrender an iota of that great doctrine of universal equal rights which is the substance and inspiration of his democracy. At least we shall not fear it, unless he is deserted by the men who placed him in power, and so be forced by them to accept of the necessary help in other quarters.—*N. Y. Post.*
