AN ARABIAN SULTANA.—Mr. Sala's letter from Algiers, which is published in the London papers, has the following:

No, you are Africa, this, indeed, is Algiers, and the Arabian Nights are all around you. There goes the Sultana Scheherazade. The Sultana walking resembles a clothes bag bifurcated, or a pair of well inflated pillows, surmounted by a bolster, and covered with a mosquito curtain. The Sultana may be one of the wives of a wealthy Morosco, or she may be a washerwoman. She Maureque, and her out door custom is invariable. It consists of a pair of very baggy galligaskins, not at all of Zouave cut, but precisely that kind of Turkish trousers which Mandano wears to the opera of Antaxerxes. These, the shintyan of the Turkish woman, are of plain white muslin; above is a quantity of semi diaphanous drapery, which I cannot attempt to describe; over all is thrown a long robe, or feminine togs, of very fine white linen or gauze, called a baik. Sometimes another baik of a somewhat stouter material is worn over the first. It is drawn close to the form, and the general composition of the pillow-case legs and the bolster body is, in the entire effect droll. The feet and ankles are bare, and from the hue of those extremities the Algerine expert is, I suppose, enabled to judge whether the veiled lady is dark or fair. Of course, I only presumed to look at the Sultana's supporters for the purpose of verifying the fact that her feet are thrust into wide shoes called sebahath which again, are cased in looser slippers of yellow morosco, the papouches or babouches.

You can see nothing of the Sultana Scheherazade's face but her eyes. The upper baik comes well down over her temples; then you have a pair of big black, shoe-like orbs, the lids so prolonged that they almost meet, or are darkened at least with kohl till they seem to join. The rest of the face is hidden by a handkerchief tied tightly behind. Some Arab ladies are said coquettishly to make use as a veil of a handkerchief so transparent that their features can be perfectly well discerned beneath; but with the vast majority of the Sultanas I have seen to-day the gauze mask has been a reality, and the concealment effectual. I don't wonder at this veil, answering to the Turkish "yashmark," having been, through so many centuries, so obstinately retained. A pretty woman may let the passers-by know, even through her veil, that she is comely; but an ugly woman is, by the merciful interposition of the knotted handkerchief, enabled altogether to hide her ill-favoredness.

A BIRD INCIDENT.—The Stockton Independent of November 9th, relates the following incident:

Some time in May last, Warner, pianist in this city, liberated four linnets, two gray and two green, from their cages in his room and sent the little warblers out into the "wide world" to take care of themselves. Imagine his surprise, when one of the birds, more tame than the others, returned to its old home in Corinthian Block on Tuesday morning last, and forthwith took possession of the cage it formerly occupied. At first, Warner thought it was some stray from some dwelling in the city, but upon further examination he found that it was his own "Bob." This he knew from the fact that at one time, in the attempt to cut a small string from the bird's foot the top of one of his toes was accidentally clipped off. Recognizing it by its foot, Warner called its name, and it immediately perched upon his extended hand as it had often done heretofore. The bird is doubly endeared to its owner.
